**POLICING SEX:
PROSTITUTION POLICY IN THE U.S.**

As concern about the issue of human trafficking grows both globally and in the U.S., questions about the policing of prostitution have increasingly come to the fore. Andrea Ritchie, an attorney and Director of the Sex Workers Project at the Urban Justice

Center in New York City, will explore how current approaches to trafficking in persons and prostitution conflate the two issues, and discuss the fallout for people who have been trafficked into sex work, people who are involved in the industry by choice or circumstance, and victims of trafficking in other sectors. Ritchie will critically examine emerging perspectives on both trafficking in persons and prostitution and offer practical, evidence-based solutions rooted in human rights and harm reduction.
