## Asa Solway, Sierra Leone Project Fellow



Asa Solway received his J.D. from the University of California, Berkeley School of Law (May 2009) and his B.A. from Colgate University (May 2004). His interests include Public International Law, Human Rights Law and International Criminal Law. While at Berkeley, he held two separate legal internships at the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY) working in the Office of the President, under Fausto Pocar, and on a defense team for the second accused in the case the *Prosecutor v. Prlić et al* (the "Greater Croatia case"). Following his time at the ICTY, Asa interned with the United States

Department of State, Office of Legal Counsel in The Hague. While at the State Department, he worked on a variety of international legal issues, including participating in hearings in front of the International Court of Justice. Asa is interested in expanding on his experiences in international law, government and human rights and humanitarian law and is looking forward to the opportunity to work in Freetown for the government of Sierra Leone.
