

BERKELEY LAW CERTIFICATE IN GREEN TECHNOLOGY LAW 2009-2010

Berkeley Law students may earn a Certification of Specialization in Green Technology Law. The Certificate gives students an advantage in competing for employment positions in the energy, environmental, intellectual property, land use, and entrepreneurship fields.

Candidates for the Certificate must complete:

1. Environmental Law and Policy, Energy Regulation and the Environment, Introduction to Intellectual Property, and Administrative Law;
2. A minimum of four other advanced courses in the Environmental Law, Energy Science/Policy, Environmental Science, or IP/Entrepreneurship categories in the Berkeley Law Course Listings;
3. Involvement in one extra-curricular activity; and
4. A substantial paper focusing on a topic related to green technology law or policy.

The paper requirement can be fulfilled through completion of the Environmental Law Writing seminar, an independent study (Law 299) or another seminar for which the student completes a major research paper, and should satisfy the school's writing requirement.

Graduate courses completed in other departments at Cal or at other universities will be considered for fulfilling the Certificate requirements at the discretion of the faculty.
