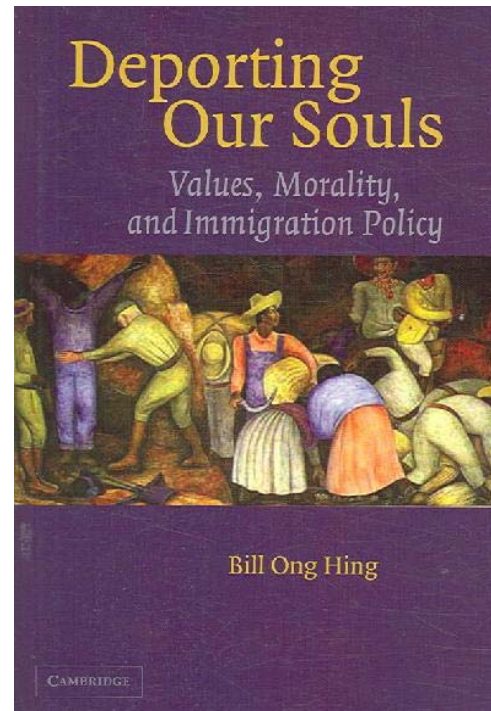

Everyday the United States deports lawful residents who have committed crimes. On the surface, this may seem appropriate, but dig a little deeper and serious questions can be raised. Many of these individuals were youngsters admitted as refugees, part of a shattered family suffering from post traumatic stress. Many of these poor or working class families have settled in inner cities or public housing. As newcomer children grow up in rough neighborhoods and rough schools, the environment takes over. When they commit a crime that makes them deportable, we have to ask whether, as products of U.S. society, their removal is appropriate. Is their deportation just?
