ADULT CHILDREN, AND INHERITANCE IN THE MODERN ERA"**

My talk offers a fragment of a chapter in a project that I have pursued intermittently over the past four years, but that has now taken more definite form. I will use an obscure and unimportant mid-nineteenth century case, *Davison v. Davison*, 13 N.J. Eq.(2 Beas.) 246 (1861), to explore the negotiations and conflicts between generations over care and retirement and support. I am trying to understand the ways forms of private ordering worked (or didn't work) to structure care for the old in the century before Social Security
