The Jurisprudence and Social Policy (JSP) Program in the School of Law at the University of California, Berkeley seeks applicants for a tenure-track or tenured faculty position in public law. Candidates should hold a Ph.D. in political science or a closely related field, and should have an excellent record of theoretically grounded empirical research in the public law and courts field broadly construed. Within this, we are open as to focus (trial courts, appellate courts, administrative processes, emerging forms of disputing, comparative legal system, transnational legal regimes, international legal regimes, and the like), and as to empirical research methods broadly construed so as to include both qualitative and quantitative analysis applied to institutional, comparative and historical analysis.

We are interested in candidates who have demonstrated commitment to excellence by providing leadership in teaching, research and service towards building an equitable and diverse scholarly environment. The candidate may be appointed at the tenure-track or tenured level, depending upon his/her qualifications and experience. The candidate will be expected to teach both graduate and undergraduate courses, and to supervise graduate student research. The candidate is expected to assume the position effective July 1, 2012.
