RE: COMPLIANCE ADVISORY - FAILURE TO COMPLETE WHOLE EFFLUENT TOXICITY TESTING
Elk Springs #3 Well, COG840009

Dear Sir or Madam:

AG Andrikopoulous Resources Inc. (AG Andrikopoulous) is subject to the Colorado Discharge Permit System, Permit No. COG840009 (Permit). The Permit authorizes AG Andrikopoulous to discharge treated wastewater subject to the specific effluent limitations and other conditions of the Permit. 5 CCR 1002-61, §61.8 requires a permittee to comply with all the terms and conditions of the permit.

A review of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Water Quality Control Division (Division) records show that AG Andrikopoulous has not completed Whole Effluent Toxicity (WET) testing or the Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) was submitted without WET data, for the following monitoring periods:

Failure to complete WET testing or failure to submit a complete DMR within the required timeframe constitutes a violation of the Permit.

The Division spoke to Will Scribner, who represents AG Andrikopoulous, on Spetember 5, 2014 and Mr. Scribner stated that AG Andrikopoulous has been unable to complete WET testing for the last three quarters due to an inability to deliver samples to the laboratory on time and other issures.

Please be aware that it is the ongoing responsibility of the permittee to take any necessary actions to maintain compliance with Permit conditions at all times. Within fourteen (14) days from the date of this letter, please submit to the Division any available WET data for the above monitoring periods and a written response explaining the cause of the non-compliance and outlining the actions and measures you have taken or will be taking to abate the non-compliance.
