Enforcement of China's Anti-monopoly Law surged in the last two years, with unprecedented penalties against foreign and domestic companies for price-fixing, resale price maintenance, and abuse of intellectual property rights. Antitrust scrutiny of international mergers has also intensified, with some transactions stalled and others thwarted by antitrust review in China. These enforcement trends reflect both the policy goals and the political incentives for regulators in Xi Jinping's China.
