Frank (D-MA)	Creates a Consumer Financial Protection Agency, a Financial Stability Council, ends public bailouts, reforms executive compensation, establishes central clearing for derivatives, strengthens regulation of securities markets, outlaws predatory lending, and requires registration of hedge funds	Signed by president	2-Dec-09
H.R. 3818	<a href="#">Private Fund Investment Advisers Registration Act of 2009</a>	Rep. Kanjorski (D-PA)	Amends Investment Advisers Act of 1940 to require advisers of some investment companies to register with the SEC	Dead (Reported by committee)	15-Oct-09
H.R. 711	<a href="#">Hedge Fund Adviser Registration Act of 2009</a>	Rep. Capuano (D-MA)	Amends the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 to remove the registration exception for certain advisors with less than 15 clients.	Dead (Referred to committee)	27-Jan-09
H.R. 713	<a href="#">Hedge Fund Study Act</a>	Rep. Castle (R-DE)	Requires the PWG on Financial Markets to conduct a study on the hedge fund industry	Dead (Referred to committee)	27-Jan-09
S. 344	<a href="#">Hedge Fund Transparency Act</a>	Sen. Grassley (R-IA)	Requires hedge funds to register with the SEC	Dead (Introduced)	29-Jan-09
S. 1276	<a href="#">Private Fund Transparency Act</a>	Sen. Reed (D-RI)	Requires advisers to private funds to register with the SEC	Dead (Introduced)	16-Jun-09
