
The Maximum Family Grant Rule:

INVADING PRIVACY, PUNISHING MOMS AND HARMING KIDS

How did welfare family caps develop?

Should the State dictate what forms of birth control a woman uses?

Do family caps reach their stated goals?



How does the MFG rule affect California families?

Should children born into poverty be punished based on their birthdates?

CalWORKs is a state program that provides cash assistance to low-income families to lessen the detrimental impact of poverty on children. However, the Maximum Family Grant Rule of CalWORKs prevents these families from receiving additional aid for a newborn, unless the mother can prove that very limited forms of birth control failed to prevent the pregnancy, or that the pregnancy resulted from rape or incest. This policy inserts the state into private family decisions, punishes moms for having babies, and harms kids born into poor families by increasing their poverty and decreasing their security.

Come hear how a coalition of advocates – from moms whose babies have been cut off from cash aid to law students and lawyers to elected officials and activist scholars – are fighting to repeal this misguided policy.
