

Library

... access study aids?

The library has several tools to help you study and ace your finals. Online study aids are accessible from the <u>Law Library Homepage</u> from the Database list.



To access **Aspen Learning Library:**

Select Aspen Learning Library from the Law Library's A-Z Database list. Sign in with your CalNet ID and password. From here you can access online materials. To print, download, or annotate, you must create a personalized account using your berkeley.edu email. Aspen titles include the popular *Examples and Explanations* series.

To access Lexis Study Aids:

Select Lexis Nexis Digital Library from the Law Library's A-Z Database list. Sign in with your CalNet ID and password. Under Featured Collections, click on Study Aids. Titles include the Understanding series and the Questions and Answers series.

To access West Study Aids:

Select West Academic Study Aids from the <u>Law Library's A-Z Database list</u>. Sign in with your CalNet ID and password. Berkeley Law students can sign up for their own accounts which allow them to highlight, take notes, download and print. Titles are arranged by law school year as well as series and include *Nutshells*, *Gilbert Law Summaries* and *Black Letter Outlines*.

To access **Quimbee**:

Select Quimbee from the <u>Law Library's</u>
<u>A-Z Database list</u>. Do not use the "log in" tab until you have created an account by following our online <u>Quimbee guide</u>.
Quimbee provides access to case briefs, study aids, and educational videos.

Other Resources for Student Study:

The Law Library maintains a <u>Study Aids</u>
<u>Research Guide</u>, available under the For
Students menu on the <u>Law Library Homepage</u>.

The Law Library also maintains a large print collection of study aids that can be checked out for 1 hour during exams and 4 hours otherwise. These study aids cover all 1L course subjects, as well as other subjects. To access print aids, ask at the Circulation Desk.
