Susan S. Silbey is Leon and Anne Goldberg Professor of Humanities, Professor of Sociology and Anthropology, and Professor of Behavioral and Policy Sciences, Sloan School of Management at MIT. Previously she was William F. Kenan Professor of Sociology at Wellesley College. Her books include *The Common Place of Law: Stories from Everyday Life* (with Patricia Ewick), *In Litigation: Do the 'Haves' Still Come Out Ahead* (with Herbert Kritzer), *Law and Science (I): Epistemological, Evidentiary, and Relational Engagements*, and *Law and Science (II): Regulation of Property, Practices, and Products*. She received the 2009 Harry Kalven Award of the Law and Society Association for a significant body of scholarship in law and society, as well as the LSA's 2015 Stan Wheeler Mentorship Award. Professor Silbey served as President of the Law and Society Association from 1995-1996. She received the Doctor Honoris Causa from Ecole Normale Supérieure Cachan in Paris (2006).
