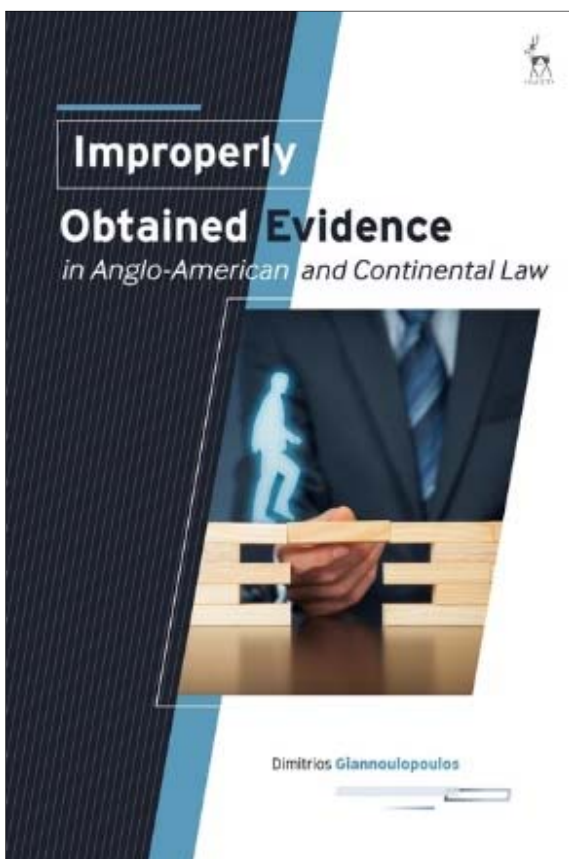

It challenges the conventional view that exclusionary rules are idiosyncratic of Anglo-American law, and highlights the “constitutionalization” and “internationalization” of criminal evidence and procedure as a cause of rapprochement (or divergence) beyond the Anglo-American and Continental law divide.
