All LL.M. students must fulfill the LL.M. degree "capstone" writing requirement by writing a paper in association with either a formal law course or faculty-supervised independent study for which credit is earned. The paper must be at least 15 pages in length and written individually.

LL.M. students who have tested out of Legal Writing & Research and are not on the thesis track must fulfill the LL.M. degree capstone writing requirement by taking another appropriate course at Berkeley Law requiring an individually-written paper of at least a 15 pages in length. The capstone writing requirement will automatically be fulfilled upon receiving a passing grade in Law 206.4 (Legal Writing & Research for LL.M. Students), or 325A&B (independent study for thesis-track students).
