Elena Kempf is a PhD Candidate in the Department of History at UC Berkeley. She is writing a dissertation on the history of weapons prohibitions in international law between the 1860s and 1920s. She is broadly interested in the histories of human rights, humanitarianism, and international law. During her time at Berkeley, Elena has worked at the intersection of history and law through her coursework, teaching, conference presentations in the U.S. and Europe, and as a Berkeley Empirical Legal Studies Fellow. She has also co-chaired Der Kreis, the UC Berkeley working group for German history, and co-organized a speaker series on European immigration issues. Elena's work has appeared on *Völkerrechtsblog* and in the *Heidelberg Journal of International Law*. She received her B.A. in History from UC Berkeley.

Elena is working on international law and international organizations, by updating a broad range of course materials. She is also researching major shifts in migration and refugee law.
