**DEFENDANTS’ MOTION TO MODIFY THE BRIEFING SCHEDULE**

Defendants, the Federal Bureau of Prisons (“BOP”) and the United States Department of Justice (“DOJ” and together with BOP “Defendants”), by and through its undersigned counsel, respectfully request that the Court modify the briefing schedule that was set on June 30, 2020. *See* Minute Order, June 30, 2020. As set out in the accompanying Opposition and Cross-Motion, ECF No. 46, Defendants determined that supplemental searches were required within the Office of Executive Office for United States Attorneys and now require more time to finish production of responsive documents to Plaintiff. The final filing date of the amended briefing schedule remains the same as the June 30, 2020 Order; only the internal deadlines have shifted.

Per the Court’s General Order and Guidelines Applicable to FOIA Cases, ECF No. 6, Defendants propose the following schedule:

- a. Defendants will serve their Motion for Summary Judgement by October 30, 2020.

- b. NACDL will serve its Opposition to the Motion and its Cross-Motion for Summary Judgement by November 30, 2020.
- c. Defendants will serve their Reply on the Motion and their Opposition to the Cross-Motion by December 18, 2020.
- d. Plaintiffs will serve its Reply on the Cross-Motion by January 20, 2021.
- e. The final filing date be set for January 29, 2021.

The briefs shall be filed as a batch within three (3) business days of the service of the last reply brief authorized by this Minute Order, but in any event no later than the Final Filing Deadline. Attached is a Proposed Order.
