Dear Ms. Graham:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for copies of records maintained by the Criminal Division (CRM). The Criminal Division located, in their files, records that originated with the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) and referred 19 pages of records to this agency for a release determination.

After careful review, we determined 2 pages are appropriate for release in full, 8 pages are appropriate for release in part, and 9 pages are duplicate pages of pages 73 through 81 in the 4th BOP rolling release and not included in the released documents for this release. Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, CRM and BOP records were redacted under exemptions (b)(5); (b)(6); and (b)(7)(C).

5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5) concerns certain inter- and intra-agency communications protected by the deliberative process privilege, the attorney work-product privilege, and/or the attorney-client privilege.

5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6) concerns material the release of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties.

5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(C) concerns records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes the release of which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties.
