Dear Ms. Graham:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for copies of records maintained by the Criminal Division (CRM). The Criminal Division located, in their files, records that originated with the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) and referred 150 pages of records to this agency for a release determination.

After careful review, we determined 1 page is appropriate for release in full, 5 pages are appropriate for release in part, 9 pages are duplicate pages of pages 1 through 140 in the 1st BOP rolling release and not included in the released documents for this release, and 4 pages were identified as non-responsive pages and removed from the responsive records. The pages are non-responsive because the records do not relate to any of the three items listed in your FOIA request to the Criminal Division. Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, CRM and BOP records were redacted under exemptions (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C).

5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6) concerns material the release of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties.

5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(C) concerns records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes the release of which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties.
