This is in reply to your Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act request dated August 2, 2018. Records were referred to our office from the Department of Justice Criminal Division.

Following the referral of records by the Criminal Division on September 20, 2019, we sent to Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) a referral of a portion of the records on October 15, 2019, containing emails among BOP, Executive Office for United States Attorneys, and the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI). However, BOP returned two pages to us after making certain redactions. EOUSA then made certain redactions and referred the pages to the FBI on November 6, 2019, for a direct response to you.
