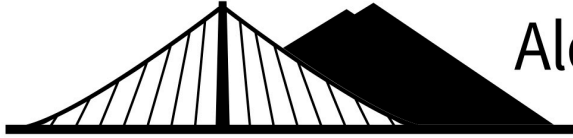

The ACCTLA recognizes that there is a need to increase the diversity among those who practice in the areas of plaintiff's litigation, criminal defense, or family law. The ACCTLA considers diversity to be a broad term that can encompass race, religion, sexual orientation, national origin, disability status, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, veteran status, socio-economic status, age, physical abilities, language, geography, overcoming personal hardship, etc. By no means is the foregoing list intended to be all-inclusive.

The ACCTLA recognizes that diverse lawyers are chronically underrepresented in the Plaintiff's bar and trial lawyers' bar and believe that it is essential to do what it can to remedy the lack of diversity so that consumer litigants, employees, criminal defendants, and family law litigants can have the opportunity for diverse representation and so that diverse perspectives contribute to the practice of law in these areas.

To promote and encourage the participation of people with diverse perspectives in plaintiff's litigation, criminal defense and family law, the ACCTLA has created a diversity scholarship, in the amount of \$5,000, which will be awarded annually to at least one second or third-year law student that demonstrates an interest in becoming a plaintiff's lawyer, criminal defense or family law lawyer. Successful applicants must also show a commitment to serving the Alameda or Contra Costa County communities and explain how their background will help advance diversity in these practice areas. Successful applicants should be able to attend the annual ACCTLA Judge's Night dinner on January 19, 2023 at which the winner will be recognized.
