Aaminah Bhat is a second-year law student at the University of California-Berkeley. At Berkeley, Aaminah's particular interests span international, technology, and immigration law. She has served as an associate editor on the Berkeley Journal of African American Law and Policy and worked with the Berkeley Afghanistan Project to support humanitarian parole applications for Afghan nationals seeking resettlement following the Taliban takeover in 2021.

Before law school, Aaminah worked at Deloitte Consulting within their government and public services sector. She also worked at the New Jersey Office of Higher Education to build equitable access to higher education for low-income and undocumented students and piloted the first free community college program in NJ.

Aaminah graduated from Yale in 2018 with a B.A. in Global Affairs. On campus she was involved with the Tsai CITY Center, Muslim Students Association, and YIRA. While in New Haven, she co-founded Students of Salaam, a non-profit supporting immigrant & refugee students through mentorship and scholarship.
