

Salzburg Global Cutler Fellows Program in International Law and Public Service

Spring 2024 Program Information

Background

- The dates selected for 2024 are Thursday, January 11 (online), TBD (online keynote), and Thursday-Saturday, February 8 10 (Washington, DC).
- The <u>three-day format</u> of the in-person programming begins with a welcome dinner for students Thursday evening and ends Saturday afternoon. There will be an optional cultural outing Saturday afternoon for students whose travel is late Saturday afternoon/evening.
- Events include consideration of student papers and renowned speakers, a networking dinner, and a Saturday mentorship and guest speaker program required for students but optional for faculty. This schedule condenses faculty commitment to one full in-person day (Friday in Washington, DC).
- Preferred candidates are 2L and 3L students, with eligibility extended on a limited basis to LLM students. Four students are selected by each of the 14 participating law schools according to a competitive process of its design.
- One academic faculty member represents each law school with a specialization in one of five areas of public and private international law: i.) humanitarian law, human rights, and use of force; ii.) international economic, investment, and monetary law; iii.) international trade, anti-corruption, and anti-trust; iv.) international institutions and international relations; and v.) rule of law and comparative constitutionalism. As this program assists students in developing scholarly articles in these subject areas, we ask that schools select standing academic faculty members who feel comfortable advising students who wish to produce a publishable piece, and are available to attend the program in-person. The students deeply value the feedback on their own written work, and it is best received through face-to-face discussion.
- Submission by each student of a <u>5-8 page executive summary</u> no later than **Thursday, January 25, 2023.**

Program Management

Salzburg Global Seminar will again serve as the managing partner for the program. Professor Mark Wu of Harvard Law and Bill Burke-White of Penn Law will chair the Planning Committee. Other academic faculty representatives will play roles in managing paper feedback during the in-person sessions with the students and during optional select office hours after completion of the program.

Sponsorship and Financing

Salzburg Global Seminar is responsible for organizing and paying for:

- Faculty economy travel and housing;
- Thursday evening welcome dinner for students;
- Meals throughout the program for students, faculty, and speakers;
- Meeting venues, audio visual, signage, and other meeting requirements;
- Program coordination including information useful for student recruitment, speaker arrangements, etc.;
- Meeting communications, including website design, posting of papers, and participant bios, etc. through the Mobilize platform.

Each Law School is responsible for:

- Appointing its faculty representative;
- Selection of four highly qualified student participants;
- <u>Travel and housing costs for its students</u> (two hotel nights with one student per room; we will negotiate a group rate).

Salzburg Global seeks sponsorship support from law firms with strong international practice interests and offices in Washington, DC, as well as from individual donors interested in supporting the Cutler Fellows Program. Law Schools are invited to do likewise from among their own constituents.
