Joseph E. Stiglitz is an American economist and a professor at Columbia University. Professor Stiglitz was recently co-chair of the High-Level Commission on Carbon Prices (World Bank Group 2017). A recipient of the Nobel Memorial Prize in Economic Sciences (2001) and the John Bates Clark Medal (1979), he is a former senior vice president and chief economist of the World Bank and a former member and chairman of the (US president's) Council of Economic Advisers. In 2011 Stiglitz was named by *Time* magazine as one of the 100

most influential people in the world. Known for his pioneering work on asymmetric information which revolutionized many fields in economics, Stiglitz is also the author of numerous popular books, and several bestsellers. His most recent titles are *People, Power, and Profits*, *Rewriting the Rules of the European Economy*, *Globalization and Its Discontents Revisited*, *The Euro* and *Rewriting the Rules of the American Economy*.
